

Directions: Fill out this reading log for each novel, according to the section breakdown in the introduction letter. You should use this template to complete the log on a separate sheet of paper, either loose-leaf or typed. Though you do not need to use complete sentences, each log should take up about one page of paper. The header on each page should include your name, the title of the novel, and the chapters that the log covers. Then, each log should be clearly labeled by what section you're filling out (before, during, after, and conflict focus). This is a before-during-after reading log, so you should complete each section before reading, during reading, and after reading. In addition, you should also fill out the conflict discussion section **after** you are finished with the first three columns. Please note that you do not need to answer every prompt provided, but rather use these prompts as a starting points for your notes. Your logs should be covering major plot points and character developments.
